UKTIS data collection and processing is covered by section 251 of the National Health Service Act 2006 and Regulation 3 of The Health Service (Control of Patient Information) Regulations 2002 (Public Health England Approval Reference Number: 13091). The NHS Act 2006 and Regulation 3 enable the common law duty of confidentiality to be temporarily lifted so that confidential patient information can be transferred to an applicant without the discloser being in breach of the common law duty of confidentiality. In practice, this means that the person responsible for confidential information (health professionals contacting UKTIS) can disclose patient identifiable information to UKTIS without being in breach of the common law duty of confidentiality.

UK Teratology Information Service (UKTIS)

UKTIS is a national service commissioned by the UK Health Security Agency:

- Provide evidence based information and management advice to HCPs on all aspects of drug and chemical exposure in pregnancy.
- Undertake national surveillance by following-up pregnancy outcomes for exposures reported to UKTIS
- Improve information available to women and their families on medicine use in pregnancy

Information required when contacting the UKTIS advice line for HCPs

In order to provide a risk assessment and/or advice for a pregnant woman and her baby, UKTIS require the following information:

Maternal details

- ✓ Name, date of birth and NHS number
- ✓ LMP and EDD
- ✓ Maternal medical history and any medications taken
- ✓ Obstetric history (how many previous pregnancies, any history of miscarriage or malformations)
- ✓ Family history
- ✓ Details of midwife / GP / other relevant healthcare professional (to enable follow-up of pregnancy outcome for surveillance)

For therapeutic enquiries

- ✓ Indication for treatment
- ✓ Treatment given or proposed (drug, dose, route, duration of treatment if known, stage of pregnancy at exposure)
- ✓ Previous treatments and efficacy

For overdose and chemical exposures

- ✓ Agent(s) involved (including route of exposure and estimated dose)
- ✓ Date, time and duration of exposure
- ✓ Maternal symptoms and treatment received
- ✓ Results of relevant investigations and fetal monitoring



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
